Scholarship Information Package

Education is an investment in your future.

Each year, thousands of dollars in funding is unclaimed in Canada. Why do eligible students miss the funding they have earned? This is because they don't know when or where to apply. This handbook will assist you in attaining all the scholarships, awards and bursary information you need.

MEETING THE CRITERIA

Here are some hints and examples of how you can show that you meet the criteria. How can you demonstrate some of the foremost qualities? You must look at **your** activities and decide what they illustrate. Be careful: do not belittle your accomplishments. Even the smallest activities will indicate some special skill or quality that is unique to you.

ATHLETIC ABILITY

Obviously, being chosen for the school team is a way of showing your athletic ability. But it is not the only way. Don't forget to include representation on local or municipal teams, and any other teams you have been on over the years. How about that golf trophy or the bowling trophy?

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

This is an activity above and beyond what is expected of you in regular classroom studies. Participation in clubs or local teams are obvious activities, but don't forget it may also include activities outside of school as well. Sports, drama, band, science clubs, photography club, or 4H are all examples of extracurricular activities.

FINANCIAL NEED

Work out your potential costs for university and the funds you actually have.

RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS

This is your home, where your parents live, even if as a student you are away from home. If you are on your own, it is probably where you are presently living and have been for a minimum time. If you split your time between two parents, you may have two residences; this may be an asset to you, so be sure to check the individual funding source for their criteria. It may mean a special letter posing your question before you make application.

VOLUNTARY SERVICE

This is going to be one of your most important criteria. Volunteer work at the hospital, helping at the Special Olympics, being a member of a service club, singing in the church choir, child minding at the local fair, coaching the little league ball team, cleaning up after the school dance are all examples of when you have been of service to others.

CITIZENSHIP

Citizenship can have two meanings. It refers to the country in which you were born. Usually this is the same as your parents, but it may be different. The label may also refer to your volunteer capabilities. Have you been someone who is helpful? Document it. Get references if you can. Have you served on committees? This may have demonstrated citizenship.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP

1. PLAN AHEAD

Request application forms as early as possible.

2. WHEN IN DOUBT, APPLY!

The element of competition may work in your favour. Let the judges decide how much eligible you may be for their scholarship.

3. FILL OUT THE POST-SECONDARY SCHOOL'S GENERAL APPLICATION FORM

Most Canadian universities and colleges provide a general financial aid application form.

4 DO IT RIGHT

- > Make a photocopy of each form to use as a working copy.
- > It is preferable to **type** your application, or use black ink to copy your work to the donor's form: colored ink does not photocopy well. Many applications have an online format that the organization prefers that you use.
- > Give full answers to every question on the form.
- > Mark response boxes with an X: no check marks, no words.
- > Be sure to answer every question.
- > Never write in the margins or outside the answer boxes. Attach a separate letter to clarify or add to the information requested.
- > Be sure that you and your parents date and sign all forms.
- > Make photocopies of each completed form, and keep them. You may need to refer to these documents again.
- > Use letter sized paper (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11") in white
- > Only include what has been asked for in the application package.
- > Mail in your application well before the due date to ensure that you do not miss the deadline.

YOUR APPLICATION PACKAGE MAY INCLUDE:

- The Application Form
- Transcripts
- Reference Letters

THE APPLICATION FORM

- > Answer each question clearly and concisely.
- > Always be aware of your choice of words. Use active, energetic words or phrases like "created" for started or began. Below are some examples of some powerful words:
- > Promoted > Coached > Established
- > Produced > Led > Coordinated
- > Instituted > Organized > Trained
- > Directed

TRANSCRIPTS

Official transcripts are only available from Alberta Education. You can order them online at http://www.education.alberta.ca/students/transcripts.aspx

A Course Mark Inquiry (Unofficial Transcript) can be printed by request from your Academic Counselor. Give them a few days notice if you need one printed.

REFERENCES

Include 2 -3 references with your resume. There are three types of references:

- a) A character reference
- b) A community reference
- c) An academic reference

Make sure that you get permission from the referee before you use their name and address for a verbal reference.

Listed below are some potential references:

- ◆ Employers◆ Teachers◆ Counselors
- Neighbours → Coaches Clergyman

If you are asking for a print reference, please give your referee a minimum of two weeks to complete the reference. Provide them with a list of all the leadership, volunteer and extracurricular activities that you are involved with. Keep the original and send a copy of the reference with your application.

DISPERSEMENT

Keep in mind that organizations may take a great deal of time after the closing date to review the applications and decide upon the recipient of the award, scholarship or bursary. Some organizations may take up to six months to make a decision, so it is important to be patient in waiting to hear back on an application you have submitted. Also remember that it is not typical to contact all those who have applied, but just the successful recipient(s).

LOANS

Provincial Government

Most provincial governments have a student loan system available. If you are a resident of Alberta, you must apply for an Alberta Student Loan, even though you may be attending university or college in a difference province.



Canadian Forces Officer Training Plan

This is designed to educate and train people for careers in the Canadian Armed Forces. It usually includes full tuition, a book allowance and a monthly salary. Contact your local recruiting officer if you are interested.





Admission Award

An Entrance award granted to a student who is beginning studies at a particular institution, at a particular level, or in a particular field of study. Students apply directly to the school that have applied to attend.

Apprenticeship

Apprenticeship is a method of learning the skills and knowledge necessary to become a journeyman. Apprenticeship combines on the job training under the supervision of a qualified trade's person and classroom training at a technical institute.

Award

Award is a general term for any financial assistance given by the decision of an administrative authority. Also used to describe prizes based on competitive criteria.

Bursary

An award based primarily on financial need, or any other perceived disadvantage. Often Bursary recipients must also meet certain academic standards, hence, the confusion with Scholarship.

Co-op (cooperative) Program

An educational program in which terms of academic study rotate with work-terms" of practical experience and gainful employment in a related field.

Credit Hour

Each course is worth a predetermined number of credits; this is often tied to the number of hours of instruction.

Degree

An academic title awarded by an institution of learning, usually for course work in their school. Generally, this is a Bachelor's, a Master's or a Doctorate. (e.g. B.A., MSc, Ph.D.)

Discipline

The subject in which the student takes their courses (e.g. law, history, chemistry)

Emergency Fund

Almost every educational institution has some sort of "emergency fund" at its disposal, in order to help students meet unexpected financial difficulties either through Bursaries or emergency loans.

Entrance Awards

An award granted to a student upon entrance to an institution or program of studies, usually in recognition of achievement or in anticipation of potential.

Full-time Student

This is determined by the university, but generally requires a minimum course load of 12 credit hours.

Graduate Student

A graduate student is one who has completed a Bachelor's degree and is working towards a Master's or Doctorate degree.

Grant

A grant is a general term describing monetary assistance for which repayment is not expected.

Honors

An honors degree requires additional course work or a more advanced level than generally required for a degree. Usually, it is only for students who demonstrate academic strength in their major area of study.

Loan

A loan is a general term for financial assistance, which must eventually be re-paid by the recipient. "Student Loans" are usually offered at preferential or deferred rates of interest.

Major

A major is the discipline in which the student specializes. Most universities have a predetermined number of credit hours, which are required for a major in any subject area.

Mature Student

A person who lacks the usual entrance course works, and is over the age of 21. The student is being granted conditional entrance and has courses he/she must take and complete successfully.

Part-time Student

Most scholarships go to full-time students. However, there are funds allocated to part-time students. Generally, a part-time student is one with 11 credit hours or less per term.

Prerequisite

This is a course that must be successfully completed before you can take the course that requires the prerequisite. It could also be described as a previous condition or requirement.

Prize

An award usually "won" by the student after competitive comparison of potential recipients. Many "prizes" are non-monetary and are often symbolic (e.g. a medal, a trophy, a "book-prize".)

Scholarship

Technically an award based completely or primarily on academic achievement, or recognition of a particular ability in a certain field.

Subsidy

A general term for any assistance that helps the recipient to begin or continue a program or project (e.g. study, training, research, employment, etc.)

Training Allowance

A regular disbursement of funds intended to assist a person undertaking a period of training in a certain field.

Undergraduate

A student who has completed some of the course work towards a degree and has been given credit for it.

Every post-secondary institution has scholarships, bursaries and awards that are offered only to students that plan attend that school. In recognition of the importance of an educated population to the future well-being of rural communities, the Alberta Association of Municipal Districts and Counties established the AAMDC Scholarship Program in 1995.
